#### INTENDED USE

Hardy Diagnostics CRITERION<sup>TM</sup> Luria Broth Base, Miller is used for maintaining and propagating *Escherichia coli* in molecular microbiology procedures with or without added glucose.

This dehydrated culture medium is a raw material intended to be used in the making of prepared media products, which will require further processing, additional ingredients, or supplements.

# **SUMMARY**

 $CRITERION^{TM}$  Luria Broth Base, Miller is based on the Luria Broth formula described by Miller for the growth and maintenance of *Escherichia coli* strains used in molecular biology procedures.

Luria Broth Base is a nutritionally rich medium designed for growth of pure cultures of recombinant strains. *Escherichia coli* is grown of pure cultures on LB Medium. Some plasmid vectors may replicate to high copy numbers without selective amplification. Some vectors do not replicate so freely, and need to be selectively amplified. Chloramphenicol can be added to inhibit host synthesis and as a result, prevent replication of the bacterial chromosome. (2)

Luria Broth Base, Miller contains one tenth and one twentieth the sodium chloride level of the Lennox and Miller formulations of LB Agar. (1-3) This allows the researcher to select the optimal salt concentration for a specific strain. The medium may be aseptically supplemented with glucose if desired.

Peptides and peptones are provided by pancreatic digest of casein. Vitamins, including B vitamins, and certain trace elements are provided by yeast extract. Sodium ions for transport and osmotic balance are provided by sodium chloride.

#### **FORMULA**

Gram weight per liter:	15.5gm/L
Peptic Digest of Casein	10.0gm

Yeast Extract	5.0gm
Sodium Chloride	0.5gm

Final pH 7.0 +/- 0.2 at 25°C.

# STORAGE AND SHELF LIFE

Store the sealed bottle(s) containing culture medium at 2-30°C. Dehydrated culture medium is very hygroscopic. Keep lid tightly sealed. Protect dehydrated culture media from moisture and light. The dehydrated culture media should be discarded if it is not free-flowing or if the color has changed from its original light tan.

Store the prepared culture media at 2-8°C.

The expiration date on the product label applies to the product in its intact packaging when stored as directed. The product may be used and tested up to the expiration date on the product label and incubated for the recommended incubation times as stated below.

#### METHOD OF PREPARATION FOR DEHYDRATED CULTURE MEDIA

- 1. Suspend 15.5gm of the dehydrated culture media in 1 liter of distilled or deionized water.
- 2. Heat to boiling and mix to dissolve completely.
- 3. Sterilize in the autoclave at 121°C. for 15 minutes.
- 4. Cool to 45-50°C. and aseptically add 10ml sterile 20% glucose solution and mix thoroughly.

# **LIMITATIONS**

It is recommended that biochemical, immunological, molecular, or mass spectrometry testing be performed on colonies from pure culture for complete identification.

Some formulations may require a settling period before pH testing of the prepared medium. If the pH is tested immediately after preparation and is out of specification, retest the medium after 24 hours to obtain final pH results. Always take pH reading at room temperature.

Standard microbiological supplies and equipment such as autoclaves, incinerators, and incubators, etc. are not provided.

# **QUALITY CONTROL**

# PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

CRITERION<sup>TM</sup> Luria Broth Base, Miller powder should appear homogeneous, free-flowing, and light tan in color. The prepared media should appear clear, opalescent, and light to very light amber in color.
