**Section 3. Hazards Identification**

**Most Important Hazards** Harmful if swallowed. May cause sensitization by skin contact.  
**Human health hazards - Eyes** \*\*\* Revised \*\*\* Moderately irritating to eyes.  
**Human health hazards - Skin** \*\*\* Revised \*\*\* Prolonged or repeated contact may cause itching and soreness and possible sensitisation. Irritating to skin.  
**Human health hazards - Ingestion** Swallowing may have the following effects:- nausea/vomiting irritation of mouth, throat and digestive tract. headache  
**Human health hazards - Inhalation** Repeated doses may have the following effects:- acts as blood poison. Exposure to dust at high concentrations may have the following effects: irritation of nose, throat and respiratory tract.

**Section 4. First Aid Measures**

**First Aid - Eyes** Immediately flood the eye with plenty of water for at least 10 minutes, holding the eye open. Obtain medical attention if soreness or redness persists.  
**First Aid - Skin** Wash skin thoroughly with soap and water. Obtain medical attention if blistering occurs or redness persists.  
**First Aid - Ingestion** Wash out mouth with water. Have victim drink 1-3 glasses of water to dilute stomach contents.  
**First Aid - Inhalation** Remove from exposure. Keep warm and at rest. Obtain medical attention.



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### Section 5. Fire Fighting Measures

**Extinguishing Media - Suitable** Use water spray, foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.

### Section 6. Accidental Release Measures

**Personal Precautions** Wear appropriate protective clothing.

**Spill** Transfer into suitable containers for recovery or disposal. Finally flush area with plenty of water.

### Section 7. Handling and Storage

**Handling** Avoid inhaling dust. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing.

**Storage** Storage temperature should be controlled to between 2 and 8 °C.

**Engineering measures** Handle the material in a fume hood/cupboard or under local exhaust ventilation.

**Protective Measures - Respiratory** Recommended: Dust mask to EN149 FFP2S.

**Protective Measures - Hands** Disposable vinyl gloves.

**Protective Measures - Eyes** Safety glasses or chemical goggles to EN166, 167 and 168.

**Stability** Stable under recommended storage and handling conditions (see section 7).
